اطلاعیه برگزاری آزمون غیر حضوری بسندگی زبان دانشگاه صنعتی شیراز

Shiraz University of Technology Online English Proficiency Test (SOEPT)

به یاری خداوند متعال، معاونت آموزشی دانشگاه در نظر دارد آزمون غیر حضوری بسندگی زبان را جهت دانشجویان مقطع دکتری در تیر ماه سال جاری برگزار نماید.

اطلاعات کلی آزمون به شرح زیر است:

- •تعداد سوالات آزمون: 5 سوال تشريحي به شرح صفحات پيوست
- •مفاد آزمون: شامل بخشهای Speaking, Listening, Reading, Writing میباشد که 25 نمره به هر بخش اختصاص یافته است (جمع: 100 نمره)
 - •مدت آزمون: ۳۰ دقیقه (جدا از بازه زمانی که فایلهای بخش شنیداری پخش میشوند)
 - •منابع آزمون: آزمون منبع خاصی ندارد اما مطالعه کتابهای آمادگی آزمون های تخصصی مانند TOEFL میتواند مفید باشد.
 - •هزينه ثبت نام آزمون: 1.200.000 ريال
 - •بازه زمانی ثبت نام: 1399/2/27 تا 1399/3/2 از طریق سایت 1399/2/27 تا 1399/3/2 از طریق سایت
- •حداقل نمره لازم برای قبولی در آزمون: 60 از 100 بر اساس مصوبات شورای تحصیلات تکمیلی دانشگاه صنعتی شیراز •رمان برگزاری آزمون: از 1399/4/11 تا 1399/4/11 تا 17 می باشد. زمان اختصاص یافته به هر داوطلب، پس از تکمیل فرآیند ثبت نام، تعیین و آگهی میشود. این زمان قابل تغییر نخواهد بود.
- داوطلبان موظف میباشند از اتصال رایانه خود به شبکه و صحت عملکرد webcam آن در طول آزمون اطمینان حاصل نمایند.

Shiraz University of Technology Online English Proficiency Test (SOEPT)

- The exam consists of 4 sections: Speaking, Listening, Reading, and Writing.
- Total exam duration is expected to be about 30 minutes.
- The exam has a maximum of 100 points. Each section has a maximum of 25 points.
- In order to pass the exam, the examinee needs to obtain a total score of 60 or higher.

> Part 1: Speaking

- 1-1: <u>Introductory questions</u>, e.g. why are you studying Ph.D., what are your next plans, why did you choose this field of work, what are your hobbies, etc.
- 1-2: Main question in one of the following forms:
 - O Asking opinion, advice, etc: The examinee is given a question and is allowed to prepare his/her answer for a 2 minute preparation time. Then, he/she has to provide the answer by speaking for a maximum of 2 minutes (Fig. 1 provides an example).
 - O **Graphical/Visual question**: The examinee is shown a graph or picture and has to speak about his/her understanding and noteworthy information provided by the graph. A 2 minute preparation time is granted after which the examinee is allowed to speak for a maximum of 2 minutes (Fig. 2 provides an example).

> Part 2: Listening

- Consists of one question. A track containing a conversation or a monolog (lecture) is played. After playing the track, the examinee has to provide a clear summary of what he/she understood, in Farsi, for a maximum of 2 minutes.
- Examiners may ask follow-up questions regarding the track (Preferably in English or alternatively in Farsi).

> Part 3: Reading

- A text is shown to the examinee. The examinee must read the text aloud, in clear English.
- Examiners may ask follow-up questions, e.g. meaning of some words in the text, or translation of some part of the text in Farsi.

> Part 4: Writing

• An essay topic is given to the examinee (Fig. 1 provides an example). First, the examinee MUST orally explain the outline of what he/she wants to write down in the essay (Preferably in English or alternatively in Farsi). At this stage, the examiners may also provide some hints (in Farsi) to help the examinee write a more detailed essay. After this stage, the examinee needs to **share his/her screen** with examiners, open a text editor (e.g. Microsoft Word) and start writing and editing his/her essay for a maximum allowed time of 10 minutes.

Important Notes For Examinees:

- The examinee must appear in **formal dress** and keep his/her **webcam** on for the whole exam duration.
- It is recommended to have pen and paper at hand in order to write down notes during the exam.
- The examinee is advised that the exam is recorded for the purpose of further evaluation and marking.

INTRODUCTION

TASK


Your task in the next item is to make a decision and then discuss the pros and cons - the possible positive and negative consequences - associated with your decision.
